MATERIALS & RESOURCES

Card Stock or heavy paper

Drawing pencils/pens/markers/paint

Various other collage supplies: glitter, sequins, ribbon, buttons.....

VOCABULARY

Artist trading cards are unique miniature works of art. In a nutshell they are homemade trading cards. There is only one rule to follow. The trading cards must be 2.5" by 3.5" in size. On the back, write the name of artist, title and number it. Once your cards are made, start trading them with friends and family. You can even search online for people to exchange cards. Anyone can be an artist with these simple cards

PROCEDURES: Step by Step through the lesson

1. Watch the instructional video:

2. Gather your materials.
3. Think of a word that describes you, your mood or what you want your future to be.
4. Create the back ground of your card with your word in mind. You can paint, collage from magazines, tissue paper, fabric....
5. When dry you can paint over, collage and use your add ons.
6. Lastly add your word and trim.
