### **Paper Sack Architecture**



Materials: Paper Sack - lunch bag works best but any size will do

Crayons/Markers

Construction paper or any heavier paper

Glue

Scissors

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Decide what type of building you will be constructing.
- 2. Drawing and gluing will be easier when the sack is still flat.

Draw the front and back. Glue added pieces such as doors, windows. Let glue dry.

- 3. Stand sack up and draw on the sides of your building and add windows.
- 4. Fill your paper bag with newspaper and tape, glue or staple the top together.
- 5. Cut a rectangular shape piece of paper the right size for the roof.
- 6. Fold in half. Add a line design for the shingles.
- 7. Glue on.
- 8. Add details.

Optional: Make more buildings to create your own neighborhood.


