
About 50 years ago, things changed. People learned that



To **reduce** means to make less of something. Write on both sides of a piece of paper. You will make less trash.




To **reuse** means to use again. Use a lunch box every day instead of a new paper bag.


Construction paper

Directions:



Look at pictures of parrots to see exactly what they looked like. Cut out 1 parrot body and 2 beaks. Glue beaks, one on each side of head matching up with each other. Add face of bird.



Cut slits in the body for the wings and tail, placement indicated by circles on picture above. Cut strips of crepe paper for tail and wings

Thread the crepe paper through the slits on the body.

Add feathers on top of head, eyes and other details.

Punch hole in top of head and tie string through it. Hang.

Hello, again! I hope things are going as smoothly as possible for you and yours during these stay-at-home weeks. Reconnecting with our families is so precious.




